All about the lesson

Read the text:

"So David left Gath and escaped to the cave of Adullam. Soon his brothers and all his other relatives joined him there. Then others began coming - men who were in trouble or in debt or who were just discontented - until David was the captain of about 400 men" (1 Samuel 22:1-2 NLT).

Memory verse:

Ecclesiastes 4:9

Two people are better off than one, for they can help each other succeed

Declaration:

I will form the best team of world changers!



Lesson points:

He accepted them despite their problems (v.2a): David never rejected anyone, regardless of the problems they had. He accepted everyone and gave them a place in his army.

A hero sees the best in every person!

He was an example in everything (v.2c): David was the captain of these men. A captain is the one who leads and guides. The best way to teach others is through our example.

A hero is a good example to others!

They were together (v.1-2): Forming a solid team of heroes requires trust and friendship. David spent a lot of time with the people who came to the cave They faced battles together and went on to become the most powerful army in the world.

A hero knows that they are stronger together!
