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Moses: The People's Hero



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Introduction

We are completing our lesson reflecting on Moses, our hero of the month of November. Moses, who was chosen by God from birth, was appointed to deliver the children of Israel from the rule of Pharaoh in Egypt. Moses became a hero for the people because He loved God and served people.

Our lesson objectives for this week:

- Teach the children that God has called them to help others.
- Teach the children that being a hero means bringing healing to others.
- Teach the children that God is pleased when we help others.

Lesson Context:

- Moses was not a hero who looked for recognition. He dedicated his life to serving the people.
- God used Moses to bring freedom and a new life to the Israelites.
- Today Moses is a hero loved by all the Jews because of all his efforts to draw them close to God.

Read in advance:

- Exodus 14 and 12
- John 10

Memorize the Word:

“I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.”

John 10:11

This week's Declaration:

I love people and I will help many know Jesus.

Word of the week:

- Serving

Opening Activity:

- Ask the kids: What does the word serving mean? What does it mean to serve others? (Get answers and examples)
- Say: Today we are going to learn about the importance of serving others. Real heroes serve and help others to know Jesus.

Opening Prayer:

(Let the children repeat after you)
“Father God, thank You this new day. We are grateful to be alive and to learn from your word today. Teach us to be heroes that will always serves others. In Jesus name, Amen.”



Read the following scriptures



Exodus 14:29-31 NIV

29 But the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left.

30 That day the Lord saved Israel from the hands of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians lying dead on the shore.

31 And when the Israelites saw the mighty hand of the Lord displayed against the Egyptians, the people feared the Lord and put their trust in him and in Moses his servant.

Discussion points:

These passages teach us a few things:

- A hero helps people come close to God. Moses demonstrated the power of God to the people so they could know Him. His main goal was helping everyone come close to God. God has called us to serve people so that they can know Him better through our lives.

The purpose of a hero is to help others come close to God.

- A hero of God does great miracles. Moses was not a hero who looked for fame and recognition. Instead, he humbly decided to do the will of God. He was therefore able to do great miracles that helped bring freedom to the people of Israel. Our mission is to find ways we can help other people and serve them.

A hero who wants to help others can do great miracles.

Application:

Let the kids think of possible ways they can help others this week. Help them with examples:

- Help mom wash or wipe the dishes
- Help my brother pick up his toys
- Help my friend to know what to study

Let them commit to ways they can serve others at home and at school.

Declaration:

I love people and I will help many know Jesus.

Prayer

“Father, thank You for choosing me to be a hero in my generation. I bring my weaknesses to the cross and ask that You forgive me and wash me in Your precious blood. I believe in You and I believe that through You I will do great things in my generation. In Jesus name. Amen.

Declare what the blood of Jesus has done for us:

- By the blood of Jesus I have been redeemed from the power of the enemy.
- By the blood of Jesus all of my sins are forgiven.
- Because I walk in the light and spend time with other believers the blood of Jesus cleanses me now and continually from all my sins.
- By the blood of Jesus I am justified and God sees me as though I have never sinned.
- By the blood of Jesus I am sanctified and set apart to do great things for God on earth.
